Regular Meeting

President Doug Baum called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Trustees Paul Mosberger and Don Charnetzky were present as well as Fiscal Officer Steve Knox. Others in attendance were Nancy Cramer, Nancy Snyder, Louis Grooms, Clarence Flowers, Vesta Reehl, Jack Burns Sr., Zoning Inspector Sharon Perrine, and Road Supervisor Mark Pahanish.

A motion was made by Charnetzky accepting the minutes and financials as presented. Seconded by Mosberger.

1st Public Speaks Session

Nancy Snyder gave an update on Melscheimer school house. They, the restoration committee, have had two meetings with an architect and a civil engineer about future plans and restoration.

Mr. Burns at 8511 Cleveland Ave complained about the dusty conditions coming out of Kimble landfill. Mosberger stated that he also received a complaint from a resident on the north side. Mr. Burns wants something done. The Trustees agreed that they will talk to Kimble about the dust conditions.

Clarence Flowers asked about the EPA monies that will be spent. Charnetzky stated that it is very vague.

He also stated that where they put their gates for flooding, it is causing some issues because people can't get turned around after they get to the gates, or don't know where to go. The Trustees agreed that the horse club should put up temporary signs telling people where to go, but it isn't possible to really tell people where to go because there are various directions people could go.

Joe Barnes Jr. discussed the water coming off of the hill up from his house. He is getting all of the wash from the neighbors property and is requesting a catch basin be put in at the head of the driveway. The outlet is on the other side of route 800. Pahanish estimated that the catch basin will be around \$500 and \$1,000. The Trustees agreed to take a look at it and discuss at the next meeting.

New Business

Charnetzky asked Pahanish if we could mow on Dueber again by where Linda Zaleski lives? Pahanish stated that they would mow it back again.

Mosberger stated that our cleanup day is the 19th.

He added that a few residents want Farber center lined. Baum stated that we did have it center-lined before. Mosberger asked for a price. Pahanish said he would get a price, but would like a letter sent to the County asking if we could put a center line on Farber.

Pike Township Trustees

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Baum would like to have a regular meeting at the pavilion at Melscheimer School sometime in July. A motion was made by Charnetzky to hold our regular meeting at Melscheimer school on July 19th at 7:30 p.m. Seconded by Mosberger.

Stark Parks wants to come down on the June 21st to our meeting. Mayor Truex called about a representative of the park board. He said the only one that he knows of that is interested, is Kelly Mosberger. Paul stated that the council already approved her as a representative.

Old Business

Sherriff's Report

No report at this time.

Financial Report

Knox gave the financial report.

He stated that this is the first time since he's been here, for 10 years, that we have to be concerned about fund balances. Our General Fund is down to \$30K. This is due to the large decrease in tipping fees.

Knox discussed the fire levies and when they are to be renewed. The one that is up this year, is the .5 mil levy that is currently generating about \$13,152. A renewal would be the same, and an estimate on the replacement would be \$36,000.

Resolution #04-2010

A motion was made by Charnetzky for a renewal estimate as well as a replacement estimate on the .5 mil for the election on November 2nd 2010. Mosberger seconded.

There is a gentleman coming from the ODNR to look at the well. Mosberger stated that he is going to try and be there when ODNR comes tomorrow.

June 15th, there is a BZA meeting about a property on Battlesburg for a carport.

June 17th, there is a hearing for the Zoning Commission to potentially change the book.

We received another complaint on the property on Ridge and Downing. The garage is down, and the house foundation is leaning worse now than ever.
