Strad also said we received a new contract offer from the Sherriff department in the amount of \$7053.67 per month. Strad stated that he would like to sign for one more year, and go ahead with the 12 hr shifts.

A motion was made by Strad to enter into a one year contract for \$84,636. Seconded by Charnetzky.
